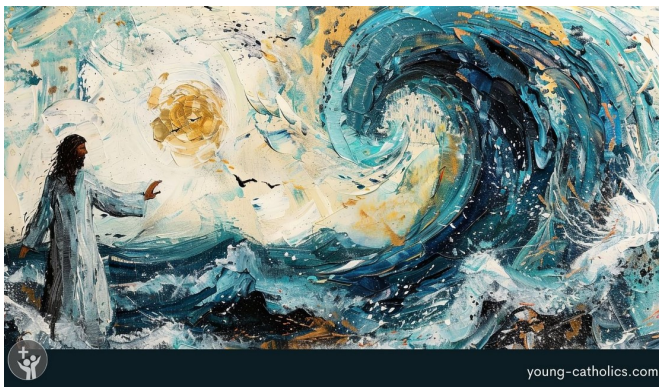

Eucharistic Reflection: Communion with Christ and the Church

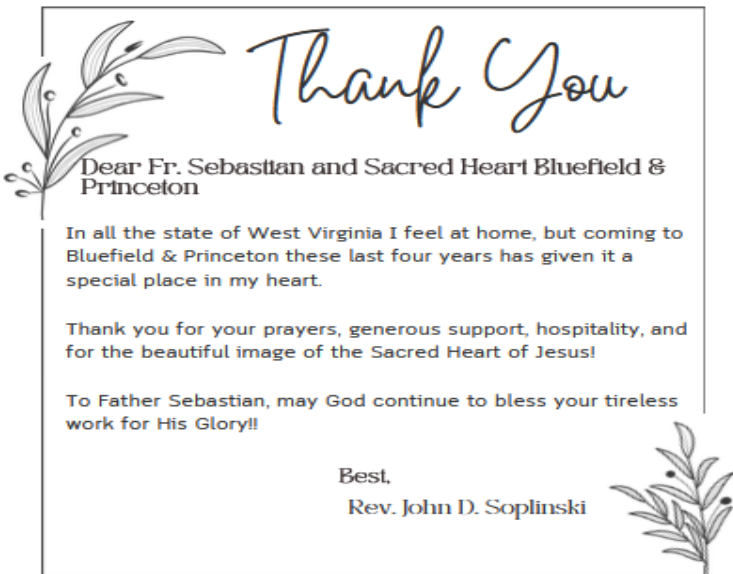
We are first incorporated into the Body of Christ, the Church, through the waters of Baptism.³⁷ Yet Baptism, like the other sacraments, is ordered toward Eucharistic communion.³⁸ The Second Vatican Council teaches, The other sacraments, as well as with every ministry of the Church and every work of the apostolate, are tied together with the Eucharist and are directed toward it. The Most Blessed Eucharist contains the entire spiritual boon of the Church, that is, Christ himself, our Pasch and Living Bread, by the action of the Holy Spirit through his very flesh vital and vitalizing, giving life to men who are thus invited and encouraged to offer themselves, their labors and all created things, together with him.

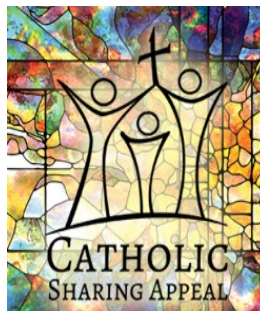

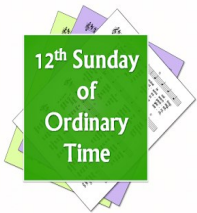
Nursing homes, rehabilitation centers and anyone who is hospitalized are not

PLEASE don't wait until after the person is unconscious or so sedated that he or she cannot communicate. It is imperative with current situations, that there be enough time for Fr. to go through the appropriate protocol to visit the actively dying.



GIVE US OUR DAILY BREAD

TALK # 5



Throughout the centuries, many customs and traditions of the Church have come and gone. Indeed, the devotions and practices of the people of God are constantly changing. One consistent thread, however, has been the daily offering of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. This should come as no small surprise to us since Holy Mother Church takes the rationale for this practice from the Our Father. The phrase “Give us this day our daily bread” seems to suppose that bread is made available each day. Of course, the bread of which the prayer speaks really is referring to the Most Holy Eucharist. Furthermore, the prayer references the giving of manna to the Israelites in the desert. Each day, it is that bread which comes down from heaven, having all sweetness within it, which sustains the people of God.

As St. Thomas Aquinas said, the Eucharist does all for the spiritual life that natural food does for the material life. Just as we must nourish our bodies each day, should we not also sustain our souls each day? It can certainly be a difficult habit to take up going to daily Mass. Maybe the times are inconvenient. Maybe it’s in the opposite direction from work. Either way, we ought to acknowledge the importance of the daily celebration and unite ourselves to it whenever possible, either in person or at least spiritually.

Having now assisted at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass every day for three years, I have come to appreciate the benefits of this spiritual practice. In my view, it has several effects. First, attending mass each day allows us to unite ourselves with the liturgical life of the Church. We hear the readings and prayers which Holy Mother Church has assigned to each day of the year. We partake fully of the seasons of the liturgical year, entering into them along with the rest of the Church and her children.

Moreover, another important effect of daily mass is that we can offer our reception of Holy Communion for someone who needs a special grace for some reason. Many people offer their reception of Holy Communion for people who are sick or suffering. This is a praiseworthy practice which the Christian faithful ought to continue throughout the ages.

Daily mass also has the benefit of allowing us to unite our prayers more closely, works, joys and sufferings to the offering of the Church, in spirit upon the paten. Imagine placing all in our lives upon the paten on which the priest will offer the sacrifice of the Mass. We lift that offering to the Lord because it is all that we must give him, and he takes our offering and transforms it, making it something which benefits us and brings us closer to him. So make daily mass a regular habit, since it might just help you to save your soul.
